Northern Brownsnake	<i>Storeria dekayi</i>	Range maps suggest that the Eastern Ratsnake ( <i>Pantherophis alleganiensis</i> ) should occur in the Toledo area, but there seem to be no local records.

Ring-necked Snake	<i>Diadophis punctatus</i>	#the taxonomy of these salamanders in our area is exceedingly complex due to interbreeding. Greg Lipps writes: (individuals) "may have mixed genotypes of the Blue-spotted, Smallmouth, Jefferson, and (less commonly) Eastern Tiger Salamander... As the first unisexual <i>Ambystoma</i> discovered had genetic complements of the Jefferson Salamander, these forms are sometimes referred to as the <i>Ambystoma jeffersonianum</i> complex."
